

# Creating & Sustaining *Positive Energy*

Kris Crusoe, RN, MN, EdD and member of the Southwestern Nursing faculty will be leading an interactive learning session on the theory of Appreciative Inquiry (AI). Crusoe, a certified Appreciative Inquiry Facilitator, will offer a workshop session entitled, "Creating and Sustaining Positive Energy," which invites participants to learn about the AI process, philosophy, and methodology. Scheduled activities include appreciative interviewing and applying the 4-D cycle of Appreciate Inquiry to identify and strengthen the Positive Energy Core at Southwestern.

Appreciate Inquiry is a process for change. AI works on the premise that each person, group and organization has positive attributes waiting to be discovered. By highlighting these

positives and allowing people to work from their cache of strengths, a more engaging environment is created. Those using the theory of AI contend that by enhancing interactions, individuals can impact processes around communication, conflict resolution, decision making, performance appraisals, and team relationships.

Crusoe's presentation will

complement the earlier viewing of the film, *Celebrate What's Right with the World*. This brief but significant film teaches what a powerful force having a vision of possibilities can be not only for individuals but for entire organizations.
