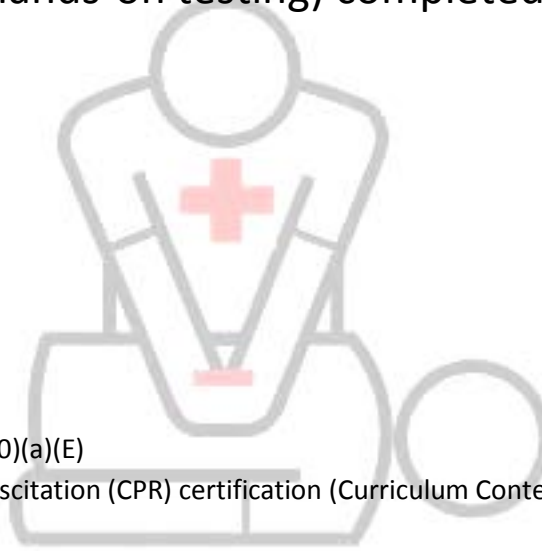


CPR CERTIFICATION

CPR Certification for students entering ALL Nursing Programs and Allied Health Programs at Southwestern Oregon Community College (SWOCC) will be accepted from the following associations or certified agencies offering their courses:

- **American Heart Association Healthcare Provider CPR** (adult, child, infant, two-person, AED, requiring hands-on testing) completed within the past two years.

- OSBN approved Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) certification (Curriculum Content for Nursing Assistant Level One Training Program)
 - Conform to the most recent International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation (ILOR) or American Heart Association (AHA) Guidelines for Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation and Emergency Cardiovascular Care
 - Include instruction in adult, child, and infant CPR and automated external defibrillator (AED); and
 - Include in-person, hands on skill practice and verification of skill competency of adult, child, and infant CPR and AED by qualified and authorized instructor

- 409-030-0230 (2)(a) Complete training program in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), also known as Basic Life Support (BLS), at the healthcare provider level. Recommended trainings for CPR/BLS should comply with the standards set by the American Heart Association

Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) Requirements

The Board approved Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) certification shall meet the following criteria for the purpose of completing a nursing/allied health training program: (a) International Liaison Committee on Resuscitation (ILCOR) or American Heart Association (AHA) guideline compliant for training, practice, and testing; and (b) In-person CPR and automated external defibrillator (AED) skill return demonstration. CPR must be completed prior to the start of clinical for a student to continue in the course. A copy of the current CPR card, front and back, must be provided by the student for the student files.
