Are you a Child Care Provider in Coos, Curry, Douglas, Klamath, or Lake Counties? If so, there are \$5,000- \$25,000 in grant funds available for capital improvements in your program!

### What are the requirements?

- 1. Must live in Coos, Curry, Douglas, Klamath, and Lake County
- 2. Licensed provider operating full-day/full-year or committed to become licensed
- Identified in Find Child Care Oregon, as willing to accept ERDC and children with special needs
- 4. Satisfactory compliance history
- Complete quarterly reports and one final project completion report
- 6. Complete Business Sustainability Activities

### What can I use the money for?

- · Become licensed and serve more children
- Increase licensed capacity and serve more children (RF to CF or CF to CC)
- Make improvements to provide a safer and better environment for children (i.e. flooring, heating, cooling, adding an outdoor play area, fence, or patio)

СДВГ: Название стимула переменного внимания: Черта (VAST) (ADHD: Variable Attention Stimulus Trait (VAST))

В курсе рассматриваются характеристики синдрома дефицита внимания и гиперактивности (СДВГ) и стратегии улучшения жизни дома и в школе. Изучите СДВГ, его вероятные причины, процесс диагностики и оценки, альтернативные варианты лечения, стратегии создания домашней среды, благоприятной для СДВГ, и как поддержать ребенка с СДВГ в школе или в детском саду. The course reviews the characteristics of attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) and strategies to improve life at home and school. Explore ADHD, its probable causes, the process of diagnosis and assessment, alternative treatment options, strategies for creating an ADHD-friendly home environment, and how to support a child with ADHD at school or in child care.

# Educational Opportunities

## <u>Childhood Education & Family Studies Program</u> <a href="#">1st Year Spring Term</a>

## COMM218Z Interpersonal Communication 4 credits

Prerequisite(s): (WR90R)

COMM 218Z increases the knowledge and use of competent communication skills to better understand oneself, others, and the role of communication in interpersonal relationships.

### ECE 154 01 Children's Language & Literacy Development - (3 Credit)

This course teaches students how to develop strategies for teaching language acquisition and literacy skill development at each developmental stage through the four interrelated areas of speaking, listening, writing, and reading. Quality children's literature, ways to implement its use, and ways to evaluate its appropriateness for young children are discussed.

### ECE 209 01 & 209B 01 Theory and Practice I Pre-K - (3 Credit)

\*Prerequisites: ECE 163/163B; Corequisite: ECE 209B. Central Background Registry (CBR) check is required for this course. You must contact Education Faculty Brenda Jackson **at least two terms in advance** to begin the paperwork process, including site placement.

## HDFS 229 01 Child Development PreK - Adolescent - (3 Credit)

This course covers the principles of theory and development for children aged six through emerging adulthood. Emphasis is placed on physical, intellectual, emotional, and social development, including a strong focus on brain development. The course readings and discussions will focus on typical development with an introduction to atypical development. Caregiving, teaching, and practice based strategies with children and adolescents are introduced.

## **2nd Year Spring Term**

## ED 134 01 Children Who are Dual Language Learners - (2 Credit)

This course focuses on the unique characteristics of teaching young children who are Dual Language Learners (DLL). Theory and best practice are studied. Emphasis is on developmentally appropriate curriculum and strategies to help dual language learners thrive in a classroom setting.

#### PE231 Wellness for Life 3 credits

Physical assessment techniques to assess present strength, flexibility, and cardiovascular health will be administered in this course. Students will receive informational tools needed to facilitate positive change in their present state of fitness. Basic blood work will assess cholesterol, glucose, and other results. Health issues and concepts are also covered.

## **HDFS222 Understanding Families: Supporting Diversity Disability and Risk**

3 credits

A practical and theoretical course examining the traditional and evolving roles and functions of families in the 21st century. Topics include cultural, ethnic, and linguistic diversity, supporting families at risk, creating professional alliances with families, communicating and collaborating with families. Emphasis is placed on understanding how the family effects the development of children aged 0 – 8.
